

Procedure for use of TAMUG Mitchell Campus boat ramp by

Student, Faculty, and Staff and Alumni to launch non-TAMUG owned vessels

Definitions:

Student: Must be a currently enrolled Undergraduate or Graduate student

Faculty: Must be a current Full Time or Part Time Faculty member

Staff: Must be a current Full Time or Part Time Staff member

Alumni: Graduate of Texas A&M University at Galveston (verified)

General Conditions:

Launching and retrieving non-TAMUG owned vessels on the Mitchell Campus Boat Ramp.

The operator of the vessel and vehicle must be the owner and also a TAMUG Student, Faculty or Staff member.

Hours of Operation: During Spring and Fall Semesters

Daylight Only

Friday at 5pm to Sunday Dark

Hours of Operation: During Summer May – August

Daylight only

Step 1.

- Pre-register your vessel.
 - Bring Copy of TPWD Boat Registration, Drivers License, TAMUG ID Card, TAMUG parking Permit and proof of insurance for vessel and vehicle to the Waterfront Operations Office. You will receive a letter stating that you are approved to obtain a launch permit

Step 2.

- 15 Launch Parking permits available per weekend to pre-registered Student, Faculty, Staff vessels first come first serve, from Waterfront Office. Launch Permits must be obtained by Fridays no later than noon.

Use restrictions:

- While launching and retrieving the vessel and while on TAMUG property the owner must also be the operator of the vessel and vehicle and must be TAMUG Student, Faculty or Staff ONLY as defined.
- Vessels and trailers staying overnight on campus on weekends must be removed from campus by 6am Monday morning
- Must have and display a valid TAMUG parking permit.
- Police Officer on duty will have the authority to rescind launch permit for failure to abide by campus rules.
- No boat cleaning or repairs are allowed.
- No fish cleaning and no discarded bait of any kind are allowed.

This is a University, not a fishing camp. Take special care with the privilege you were granted and treat our campus with the care and respect it deserves.

Parking for trucks and trailers:

Parking area-D-LOT Any violation will be cited for failure to park in designated parking area.
