<p>Texas A&amp;M University at Galveston is committed to reasonably accommodating qualified students with disabilities who may require the use of an assistance animal in accordance with the Fair Housing Act (FHA) and Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act. Assistance animals are identified as therapy, comfort, or emotional support animals that alleviate one or more identified symptoms or effects of a student’s documented disability to allow them equal opportunity to reside in University housing. Assistance animals are not service animals, as defined in the Americans with Disabilities Act.</p> <p>Assistance animals are restricted to on-campus housing and are only allowed in the residence hall room, suite or apartment the individual with a disability is assigned to by Housing and Campus Living &amp; Learning. They are not permitted in classrooms, offices, auditoriums, gymnasiums, dining halls, or other similar on-campus settings. An individual with a disability may be asked to remove an assistance animal from University housing if the animal’s behavior is not consistent with behavior expected in a residential environment, poses a substantial or direct threat to personal or public safety, causes substantial physical damage to the property of others, or poses an undue financial or administrative burden on the University.</p>
