







## Notables for the Corps of Cadets, November 2023








## TAMMAH Rocks Date: November 21, 2023








# Career & Counseling Services
















- In November, Career Services hosted a successful information session with Marathon, hosted by former student Masters of Maritime Administration student Mark Sawyer '22.
